In addition, units with 10% or more missing maternal race/ethnicity for combined deaths were also identified as having major reporting problems.

Classification of the major reporting problems is as follows:

- A Over 10% missing infant deaths, 5% or more of them are unlinked;
- B Over 10% missing infant deaths, 5% or more of them are linked;
- C Over 10% missing fetal deaths;
- D Over 10% imputed combined deaths, 10% or more imputed infant deaths;
- E Over 10% imputed combined deaths, 10% or more imputed fetal deaths;
- F Over 10% missing maternal race/ethnicity, 10% or more among infant deaths;
- G Over 10% missing maternal race/ethnicity, 10% or more among fetal deaths.
